On Sunday 30 July, mine staff and their families will be gathering at the Miners' Reflective Area at Gilmour Reserve to dedicate a plaque to our colleague Tipiwai Stainton who died underground in July of last year.

Tip will not be the only person we remember on that day. We will also pay our respects to those others who have lost their lives in mining accidents since modern mining began in Waihi.

All of these men will be remembered on Sunday 30 July. A plaque for each man will be placed adjacent to those already in place in memory of the Pike River 29. Family members and friends of each man have been invited to attend. Members of the public are most welcome to join us on this day.

Activities start at 2.00pm at the Miners' Reflective Area, Gilmour Reserve. You can access this area by walking past Gilmour Lake, by using the George Street entrance for the reserve which is a new park, or by parking at the bottom of Clarke Street and walking a short distance to the reserve.
