Waihi Gold received consent to develop the Correnso Underground Mine in October 2013. The Correnso Consent Conditions include a requirement for a Social Impact Management Plan (SIMP).

The purpose of the SIMP is to provide a framework to identify, assess, monitor, manage and re – assess the social effects on the community of the Correnso Underground Mine in combination with the other OceanaGold mining projects operating in the Waihi area. It includes a set of indicators that monitor the social effects of the company's mining operations over time.

An annual report on these indicators is put together by a third-party consultant on behalf of OceanaGold Waihi and is regulated by Hauraki District Council.

Statistics, views and opinions of various stakeholders including Waihi residents, community representatives, local business operators and OceanaGold's workforce are collated to form the data in the report and management plans for six-themes are put
