RAINFALL ON SITE

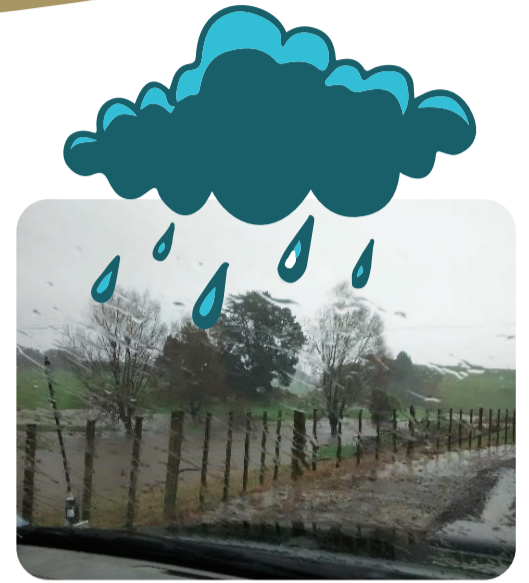
When we get significant rain events like those we have had recently, we often get asked how the mine site copes with such large volumes of water.

We continue to operate as usual. The mine site is designed and managed to handle significant rainfall events and to ensure that any discharges - even during large storm events - do not cause adverse effects on the environment.

Our tailings impoundments, collection ponds, and silt ponds are all constructed and operated to cope with significant rainfall and stormwater. We cannot contain all stormwater on site. Consent conditions allow the site to discharge stormwater runoff into the Ohinemuri River or Ruahorehore Stream subject to specific requirements.

Any water that enters Tailings Storage Facility 1A (the currently operating TSF) however, the underdrain system built into our tailings impoundments on site, any water from our underground operations, or from around the processing plant is always sent to our Water Treatment Plant for processing.

Monitoring of the Ohinemuri River and Ruahorehore Stream is carried out regularly and includes water and sediment quality monitoring and biological monitoring. Regulatory authority Waikato Regional Council monitors our performance.
