THE 2021-2022 SOCIAL IMPACT MANAGEMENT PLAN REPORT

Since 2015, OceanaGold Waihi have commissioned and released a Social Impact Management Plan (SIMP) Report. This biennial report is an independent review of our social effects within the local and wider communities, and includes data from our annual staff survey.

The SIMP report has been developed and revised over the years through an iterative process involving OceanaGold, the Hauraki District Council, and in consultation with various stakeholders, including Waihi residents, community representatives, local business owners, and the operation's workforce.


The SIMP report is structured around six main themes: Economy, Employment, Property, Community, Health and wellbeing, and the Future of Waihi and the OceanaGold NZ legacy. Some key findings from the SIMP report for 2021 and 2022 are highlighted below.

OceanaGold's Waihi operations are an integral part of the Waihi community, and have significant beneficial effects at the regional level also. The SIMP report provides an ongoing way to track our social effects and share them with the wider community.


