SUSTAINABILITY REPORT 2023

In May we released our annual Sustainability Report. This document details OceanaGold's sustainability performance for 2023 across all our operations around the world. In this Update we cover some highlights from the report, explain what a sustainability report is, and why sustainability is important to the way we do business.

HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2023:

- Zero material environmental effects across all sites. We are proud to report we had no significant environmental incidents in 2023 and all sites continued to maintain and implement their biodiversity management plans.
- Independently assured OceanaGold's conformance with the 'Responsible Gold Mining Principles' and 'Conflict-Free Gold Standard'.
- Social investment contributions of over \$9M USD and over \$198M USD spent with local suppliers across all operations.
- Energy and greenhouse-gas emission reduction plans were developed for all sites, with energy and emission reduction projects incorporated into Life of Mine plans and budgets.
- At Waihi we maintain and implement management plans for hazardous materials and chemical substances. This includes a site-specific Cyanide Management Plan which meets regulatory requirements and aligns with the principles of the International Cyanide Management Code (ICMC). In 2023, the Waihi site was independently audited, and was determined to be compliant with our plans and meeting the ICMC requirements.

WHAT IS A SUSTAINABILITY REPORT?

Sustainability reporting is the disclosure of environmental, social, and governance roles. These are often referred to as 'ESG'. Our Sustainability Report describes what our ESG goals are, as well as detailing what our action plans are to reach each of the targets and whether we have achieved these during the reporting period.

OceanaGold's Sustainability Report has been prepared with reference to the Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) Standards and the GRI G4 Mining and Metals Sector Disclosures. GRI provides the world's most widely used sustainability



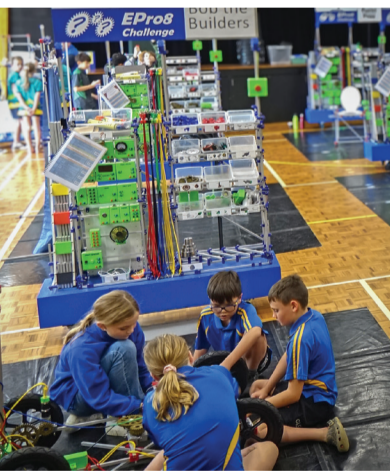
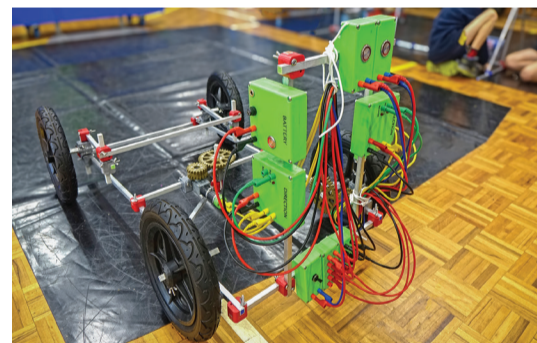
reporting standards. This external verification process and the use of a recognised reporting framework provides robust, verifiable data which tracks our performance and provides for transparency and dialogue between OceanaGold and our many stakeholders.

OceanaGold's activities touch people's lives – our staff, contractors, suppliers, and people in the communities in which we operate – and we take our responsibilities to them and the environment seriously.
