


Working in the 'new normal'

Jumbo blessing

Last week Tim Ainsley and Erika Warren from Waihi Community Marae joined us on site to bless a new machine before it heads underground to start work.

JD041 is the latest addition to our mining fleet. Officially it is a Sandvik DD421-60 Development drill, but we know it as a Jumbo.

JD041 is a sister drill to JD040, our recently refurbished DD421-60, seen in the background in the photo above. These new machines are an upgrade on our old jumbos and can drill longer rounds making us safer and more productive.

These rigs are fitted with onboard dewatering pumps to allow them to pump out the decline headings they are working in without separate pump setups.

They are also fitted with the state-of-the-art Yumarr boom immobilisation protection systems which keep the drill rig offside safe when they are loading the drill rigs with ground support bolts.

These machines form part of our plan to ramp up to develop 12km of tunnels a year to bring the Martha orebodies into production.
