

## Working transparently ...



Maintaining physical distancing as staff move around the site has required some ingenuity and innovation. In particular, getting staff underground at the beginning of each shift has required us to work very 'transparently'. In the photo above the driver and passenger are separated by clear plastic sheeting—a flexible version of what you currently may be used to seeing in many shops. The same clear plastic sheeting separates the front from the back and the passengers on each side.



Last month we reported that members of Waihi Community Marae had joined us on site to bless our new Sandvik Jumbo JD041. They did the same thing in January for JD040. The two photos above show both machines in the workshop, and JD040 at work in the Empire 008 Access last week. These new machines will help us meet our target of 12km of tunnels each year as we bring the Martha orebodies into production.
